REPORT ON ANTI-RAGGING AWARENESS PROGRAMME

An Anti-Ragging Awareness Programme was conducted for the first-year B.Tech students of the Information Technology Department on 03.09.2026. The programme aimed to create awareness among students about the importance of maintaining a safe, positive, and friendly academic environment. The Head of the Department (HoD), Staff Advisor, and faculty members interacted with the first-year students and discussed the seriousness of ragging and its negative impact on students and the academic environment. The students were informed that ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and that every student has the right to study in a safe and supportive atmosphere.



During the interaction, the faculty members asked the students whether they had experienced or witnessed any form of ragging, harassment, or uncomfortable behaviour within the department or campus. Students were encouraged to speak openly and were assured that their concerns would be taken seriously. The faculty members also explained to the students the importance and role of the College Anti-Ragging Committee in preventing ragging and addressing complaints or incidents related to ragging. The students were informed about the available support systems and encouraged to approach the Anti-Ragging Committee whenever they faced or witnessed any such issue.

The students were clearly instructed that if they encounter any incident related to ragging, they should immediately report the matter to the Staff Advisor, HoD, any faculty member, or the College Anti-Ragging Committee without hesitation. They were encouraged to report any such incident promptly and not to remain silent or ignore it.

The session helped the students understand their responsibilities and the importance of mutual respect, discipline, cooperation, and maintaining a ragging-free campus. The faculty members assured the students of their continuous support and guidance whenever required.
